## The Glass Slipper Project will adhere strictly to the following rules:

- o Students **MUST** be juniors or seniors currently enrolled in a high school.
- O Students **MUST** be physically present at the boutiques in order to receive a dress (parents, friends and teachers may <u>not</u> shop for them).
- Students MUST bring their school IDs or a letter from their principal on school stationery or they will not be permitted to participate.
- O Students are encouraged to bring a relative or guardian who will be permitted to shop with them. Other family members may wait for the student in the waiting area.
- Students with small children will need to bring someone to watch them. Babysitting services are not provided.
- o Students will be allowed to receive ONE dress, plus related accessories and makeup, if available.
- We encourage the students to bring something to read as well as something to eat and drink while they wait.
